Alabama African American Civil Rights Heritage Sites Consortium Relocates to Historic Birmingham Civil Rights District

Birmingham, AL – We are pleased to announce that effective November 1, 2023, the Alabama African American Civil Rights Heritage Sites Consortium (www.aaacrhsc.org) has begun relocating its offices to the Creed63 Coworking Space (www.creed63.com) at 413 16th St. N, Birmingham, AL 35203. Creed63 is housed in the Arthur Shores Law Center building in the heart of the Birmingham Civil Rights district.

Arthur Shores was an attorney, Civil Rights activist, and Birmingham City Council representative. Known as “The Dean of Lawyers,” he was the attorney for Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth, and many other Civil Rights Movement foot soldiers. Attorney Shores also argued before the United States Supreme Court to integrate The University of Alabama.

Creed63’s mission is to assist in the economic development and historical dignity of the local community of the National Historic Civil Rights District and its entrepreneurs by way of providing a space that is vibrant, promotes culture, and assists entrepreneurs through community programming, business resources, small business startup education and the development of sustainability programming for community business owners.

The Consortium is proud to become a part of the Creed63 coworking community, which provides modern workspace, high-tech meeting rooms, and various office amenities in an area rooted in Birmingham's civil rights history. The new offices are strategically located near Consortium founding member sites Sixteenth Street Baptist Church and St. Paul United Methodist Church, as well as the historic Kelly Ingram Park and Birmingham Civil Rights Institute.
